

BRINGING THE MILL SITE BACK TO WORK

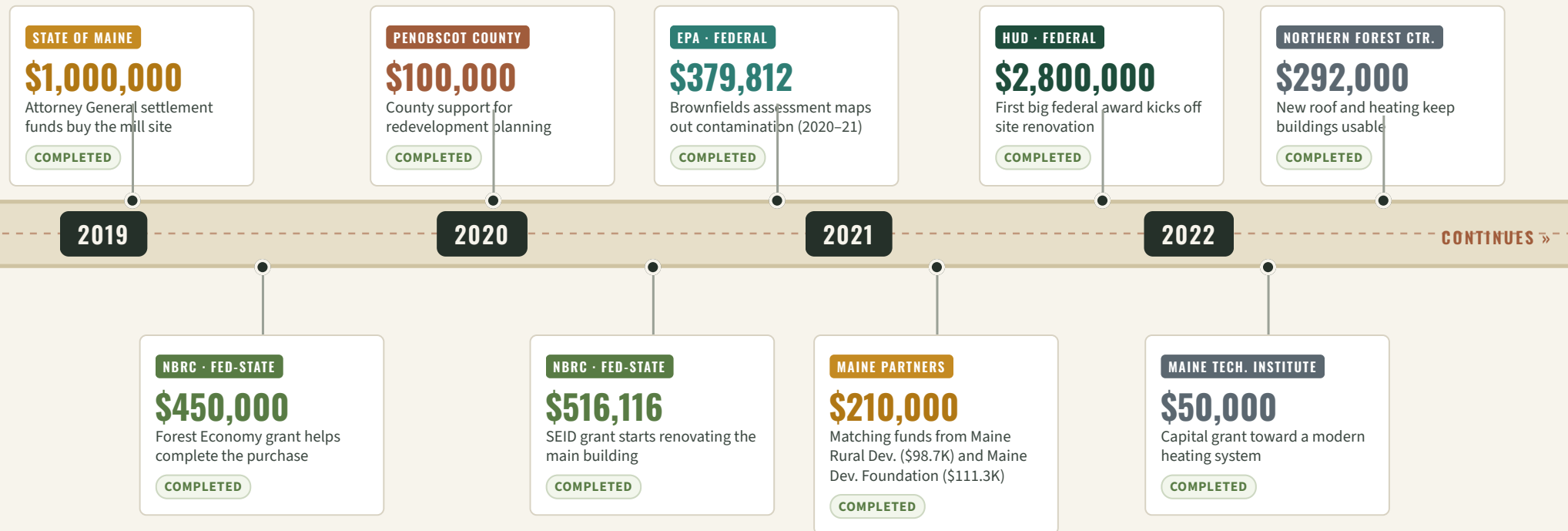

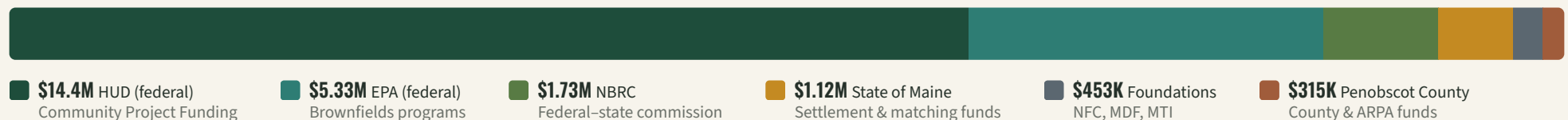

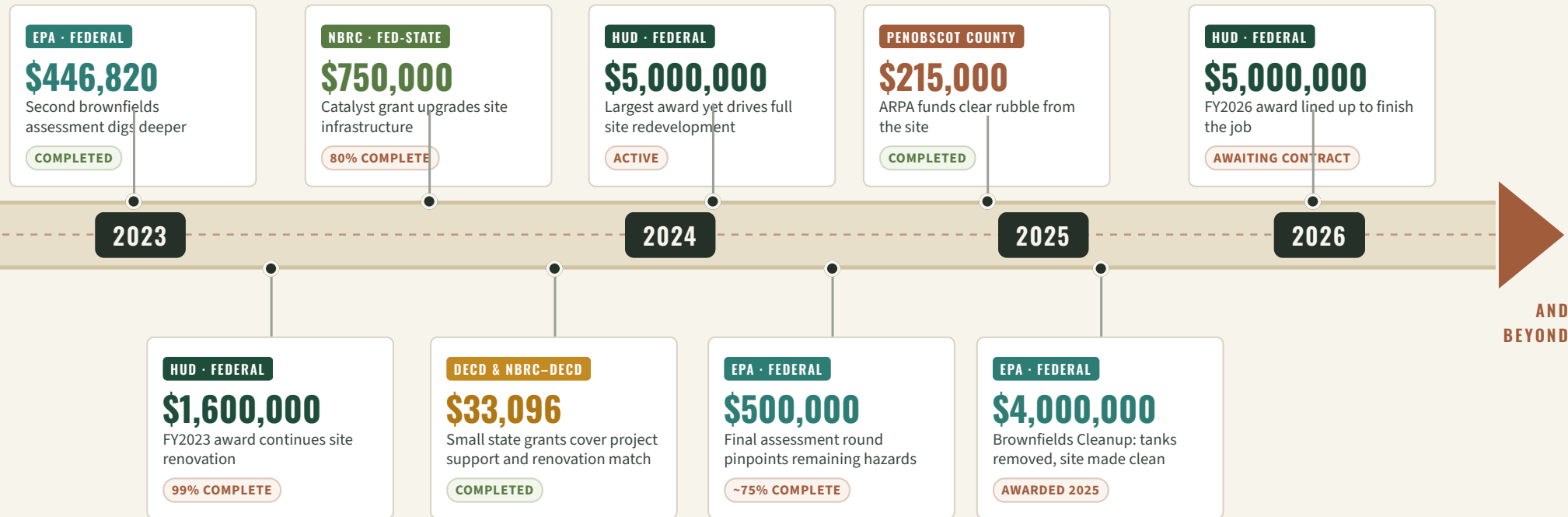
WHERE THE MONEY COMES FROM

Every color on the timeline is a funding partner · share of \$23.3M

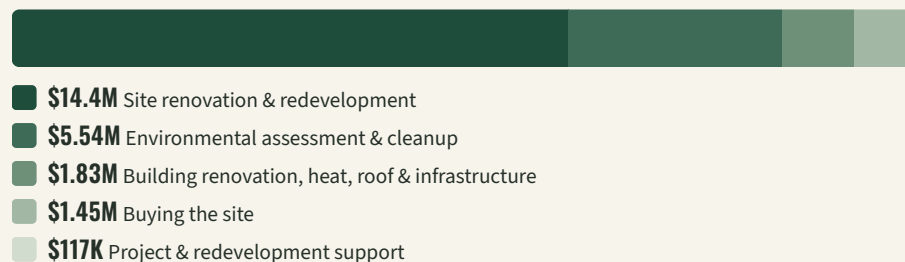


« 2023 – 2026 · THE INVESTMENT ACCELERATES

- 1 A CLEAN, SAFE SITE**
Old tanks, rubble, and industrial contamination assessed and removed — turning a liability into usable land.
- 2 BUILDINGS BACK IN SERVICE**
Renovated space with a new roof, modern heating, and upgraded infrastructure, ready for new employers.
- 3 LOCAL DOLLARS MULTIPLIED**
Modest town, county, and foundation investments have leveraged nearly \$20M in federal funding for the Katahdin region's economic future.
